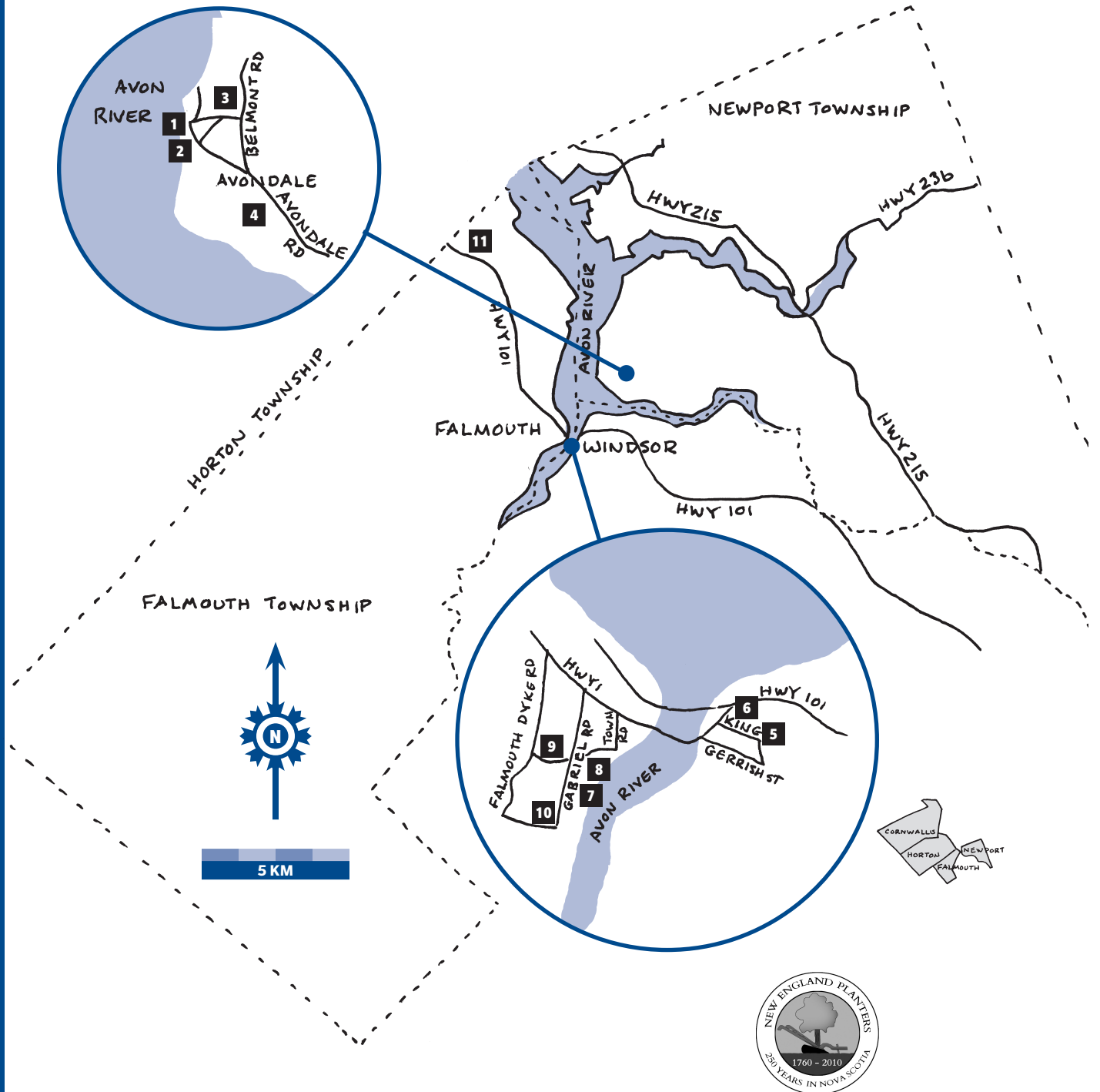


Newport & Falmouth Townships 1760–1820

Some Planter Sites

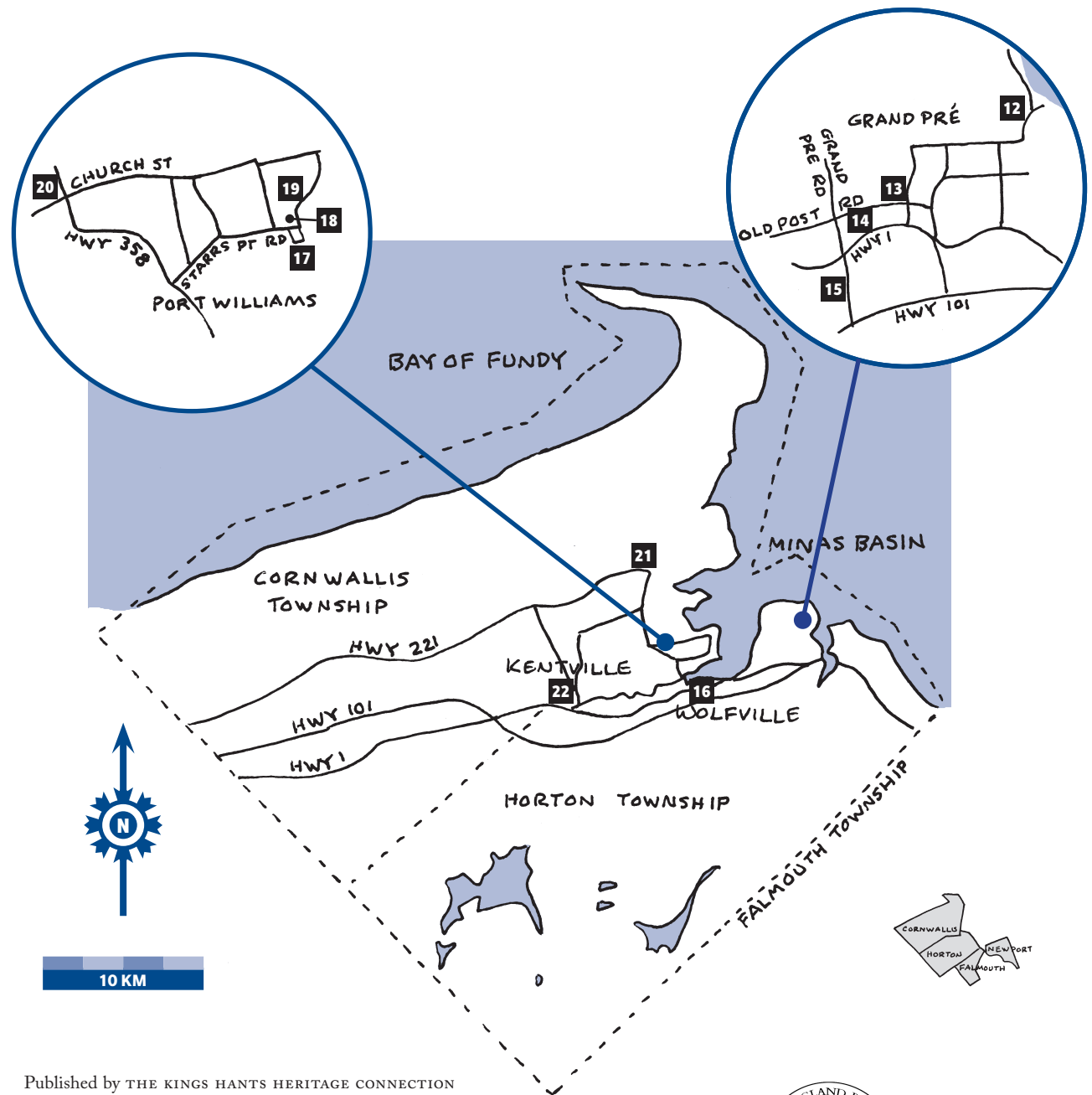
- i. **Newport Landing:** Planters arrived aboard sloops Lydia & Sally in May, 1760.
- ii. **Newport Town Plot:** Location of the original Town Plot 1760.
- iii. **Avon River Heritage Museum:** Planter records include community meetings beginning 1760 and continuing some 50 years.
- iv. **Newport Landing Cemetery, est. 1810:** Believed to be a burial ground since 1761.
- v. **West Hants Historical Society Museum**
- vi. **Fort Edward**
- vii. **Falmouth Landing:** New England Planters arrived here in May, 1760.
- viii. **Falmouth Centre Cemetery**
- ix. **Henry Alline Monument:** Leader of the New Light movement which influenced development of the Baptist Church.
- x. **Fort Lawrence:** Location of a palisaded fort built c. 1760 (private property, no traces of the fort remain.)
- xi. **Hantsport Historical Society Museum**

12. Horton Landing: Cairn marking the arrival of Horton Planters in 1760.
13. Hortonville: the original Horton Town Plot 1760.
14. Jeremiah Calkin House, 1768: 210 Post Road (private home).
15. Covenanter Church, c.1805: Grand Pré Road.
16. Atwell House, 1761: 654 Main Street Wolfville (private home).
17. Cornwallis Town Plot: Cairn marking the arrival of Cornwallis Planters in 1760.
18. Planters' Barracks, 1778: Starr's Point Road.
19. Prescott House c.1800: Starr's Point Road (Provincial museum).
20. St. John's Cornwallis Anglican Church, 1804: Highway 358 at Church Street.
21. Apple Tree Landing: Highway 221, Canning (Planter settlement and shipyards).
22. Kings County Museum: 37 Cornwallis Street, Kentville (permanent Planter exhibit and genealogy centre).
